If day 30th exists in the lunar calendar, is it a working day? ,
It is a work day but also a PREPERATION day for the Rosh Chodesh.
If it is a working day , it is the first in a 6-working day cycle (according to Ezekiel 46:1;Genesis 1 ;Exodus 16:26).If it isn't , it is either Shabbath or Rosh Chodesh (the cycle is broken).

No not correct. We answer this at the link above. I hope language is not a barrier here. There is no such thing as an unbroken chain of 7 days from Mt. Sinai, or the Garden of Eden. YHWH designed the heavenly calendar to STOP every month so that the weeks would be RESET. The new month is given so that we start A NEW CYCLE of 4 weeks every 30 days!!! That's why each month is NEW and NOT CHAINED. Please read and study: **The Myth of the Unbroken Chain of Days**

Let us see the example in the manna issue in Exodus 16:26. It is written: “Six days you are to gather it, but on the seventh day, the Sabbath (Shabbat), there will not be any “. On the 28th, it must have fallen manna for two days because the 29th is a Sabbath.

Correct!!!!

What happens to day 30th? If there is manna, according to Scripture, a 6-day – manna cycle starts and the month reckoning cycle is broken, because day 30th would be the first day of the week. The first day of the next month would be the second of the week, and so on.

The 6 months a year with 29 days have no issues. Shabbat at sundown is Rosh Chodesh.

The 6 months with 30 days, the 30th day is a-THE PREPERATION day for Rosh Chodesh.

It is not a 6 day work day, nor a weekly, or annual Shabbat.

Nowhere in YHWH's Word does it tell us that weeks cannot have days in between. That is a long held myth/lie!!!

We THINK Scripture says that, but you cannot find the verse, or the concept outside of Roman thinking! Same with the Year of Jubilee for a biblical example.

The 50th year is not part of the previous 49 years, nor the next set of 49 years. It DIVIDES the Jubilee cycles, just like the 30th day and every Rosh Chodesh DIVIDES-le havdaal-HAVDALLAH between months.

This is not only not a problem for the biblical lunar Shabbat; it is a divine COMMAND to insert these DIVIDERS!

We need to depart from Roman thinking immediately and enter a full Hebraic thinking. The same would apply to the example of manna.

Manna fell every day of the MONTH, but once a week started, on Yom Sheshee, Day 6, there would be enough for 2 days. In other words, Manna fell every day, but Shabbat and fell 6 days before Shabbat uninterrupted. Correct!

YHWH was teaching us that once a week starts it cannot be interrupted.

But the point is that there are and were always days and years on the Hebrew solar lunar calendar put there by YHWH HIMSELF to divide weeks and months and years and those days in the wilderness, He still fed us, even though they counted as days of the month, but not days of the week. Same with Jubilees. They counted as a YEAR, but not as part of the previous 49 years! You are correct! A week, once it starts, can never be broken!

But there are DIVINELY appointed days in between the old set of 4 weeks and the NEW set of 4 weeks! On those havdallah days, YHWH still fed us manna

for those 40 years! But since the 30th day and Rosh Chodesh are never week days, no commandments, or patterns were broken when YHWH provided manna for those non week days! Our Roman minds, programmed in schools and workplaces since our childhood, MUST become fully renewed.
